The basic jurisdiction of a U.S. Bankruptcy Judge is specified in Title 28, U.S.C. and explained in Title 11, U.S.C., as well as in 98 Stat. 344, Pub. L. 98-353, Title I, § 120.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must satisfy the following conditions: (1) be a member in good standing of the Bar of the highest court of at least one state; (2) have engaged in the active practice of law for at least five years; (3) be competent to perform the duties of the office; (4) possess a commitment to equal justice under the law; (5) have demonstrated outstanding legal ability and competence; (6) indicate by demeanor, character, and personality that one would exhibit judicial temperament if appointed; and (7) not be related by blood or marriage to a U.S. judge at the time of initial appointment.
